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## Course overview

### Name

Climate Change – an introduction for staff and volunteers

### Description

The course provides an introduction to climate change and aims to help staff and volunteers understand how they can contribute to addressing related issues in their day to day work within local communities.

The course is designed for smartphones, tablets and desktops and lasts approximately 30 minutes. It has been structured in five short modules, with a small exercise at the end of each module to rehearse the learning.

### Learning objectives

The course reviews the main causes and consequences of climate change and summarizes its impact on the mandate and work of Red Cross Red and Crescent National Societies.

The approach taken by the Red Cross Red Crescent to address both the root causes (mitigation) and the consequences (adaptation) of climate change is explained.

Finally the course discusses how Red Cross Red Crescent staff and volunteers can help address climate change issues in their daily work and underlines the urgency to do so.

### Background

Climate change will severely affect the lives of millions of people around the world. It is not only a global environmental problem, it is also a global humanitarian problem which will be felt by everyone and will affect vulnerable people the hardest.

However, there is still a lack of familiarity with climate change issues and with the ways staff and volunteers can help address this challenge in their day to day work with local communities.

This brings about the need to strengthen organisational capacity and scale up Red Cross Red Crescent action on climate change.

### Intended audience

This course has been developed for Red Cross Red Crescent staff and volunteers with no or limited knowledge of climate change issues.

### Content

- **Setting the scene**  
Introduction to the learning objectives.
- **Module 1: The causes of climate change**  
Provides an overview of the main causes of climate change, including a short video. Emphasizes the difference between weather and climate.
- **Module 2: The impact of climate change**  
Provides an overview of the various impacts that may be attributed to climate change.
- **Module 3: Impact on the Red Cross Red Crescent work and mandate**  
Discusses how climate change affects vulnerable people and thereby the Red Cross Red Crescent work. Describes the commitments made by the Red Cross Red Crescent to address climate change.
- **Module 4: The Red Cross Red Crescent approach**  
Provides case studies to illustrate how the Red Cross Red Crescent mainstream climate change consideration into existing programming.
- **Module 5: How can I help?**  
Reviews how staff and volunteers can contribute to addressing both the root causes of climate change (mitigation) and the consequences of climate change (adaptation).
- **Summary**  
Provides key messages.

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I can see the course welcome page but nothing happens when I click on the link...

You will need to disable your pop-up blocker or create an exception for the Learning platform site ([www.ifrc.org/learning-platform](http://www.ifrc.org/learning-platform)) so that new windows can be launched.

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My course seems to have disappeared from the platform. What do I do?

It may be that your course has been archived (probably not intentionally). You will need to re-activate it before being able to continue the course.

To reactivate a course, please follow these steps:

1. In the “Learn” tab of the Learning platform, click the round blue button. This will enable you to access your archived training.
2. Click on the title of the course that you would like to bring back to your regular training record.
3. At the bottom of the course description/information, you will find a button which says “Activate.” Click it.
4. Once it is done, you may need to click again on the blue button and select your training record.

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Where can I find my certificate?

A certificate for course completion will appear at the end of the final test, with your name on it. You will also be able to print a certificate by opening your curriculum and clicking on the “certificate” link that will appear after completion of all items on the course.

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How much time do I have to complete the course once started? How can I save my progress?

Unless you are taking the course because it is a prerequisite for being a volunteer or staff member in your branch or National Society offices, you have as long as you want to complete the course. When you log back into the Learning platform and the course, you can start from where you left off. Once completed, you are free to go back to the part that you want, to find resources or prepare for the test.
